8 ANTI-EPILEPSY AND MOOD STABILISERS

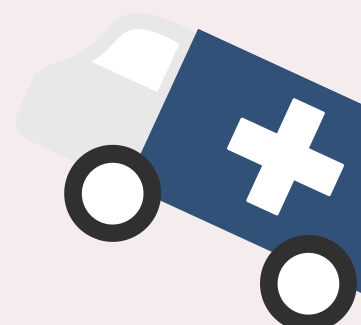
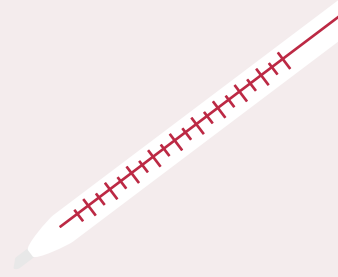
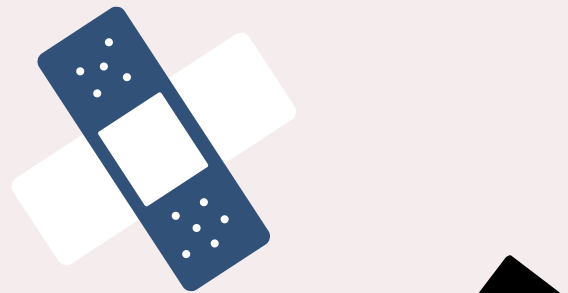
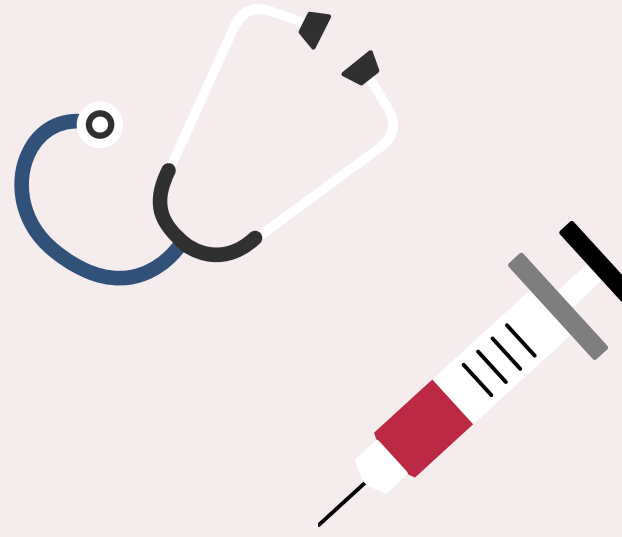
